Top Ten benefits provided by the CRMCS...

1. Personnel accountability
2. Resource identification
3. Resource reliability due to FEMA ,NIMS, and State typing standards
4. Situational awareness of an incident via InterTrax exchange
5. Sharing of the workload by allowing usernames and passwords for individual agencies or organizations to update their own data
6. Quick visual reference of deployable resources with ties to Kansas- MAP and its closest resource tool
7. Possible medical certification / license / registration verification through KSERV
8. A sunflower decal on drivers license to identify system members
9. Helps facilitate mutual aid
10. Accessible from anywhere with an internet connection

Project Overview

The Kansas Division of Emergency Management (KDEM), in partnership with the Kansas Homeland Security Regions, is preparing to roll out a new comprehensive resource management tool. This tool will allow county emergency managers / responders the ability to credential personnel, provide information on availability of assets and personnel during an emergency, the ability to track those assets on scene, and complete incident visibility via the internet. The resource information will be housed in the web based Resource Management Web (RMW) / InterTrax Exchange system.

Resources in the RMW system will be typed by the FEMA Tier I NIMS standards. Assets that fall outside those standards will be identified and given state specific Tier II types as defined by the subject matter experts in the appropriate discipline / Emergency Support Function (ESF).

InterTrax Exchange is a web based tracking system that allows those with appropriate permissions the ability to track, in near real time, the people and assets on scene at an incident. This will provide the opportunity to predict possible needs to effectively manage the incident.

Both, RMW and InterTrax Exchange, are scheduled to launch at the Kansas Emergency Management Association (KEMA) conference in September of this year. The standards for typing and credentialing will follow and the project is expected to be complete July of 2014.

Coordination

The CRMCS is working closely with many entities to make this a truly comprehensive system.

Kansas—MAP– All resources that have been identified as deployable will be displayed in Kansas—MAP and will be searchable using the “closest resource” tool. This will allow you to look for assets you may need in rings around your county. The search would start with the counties immediately surrounding yours and move out to the region and then out to the state.

Kansas Department of Revenue (KDOR)– CRMCS will be tied to KDOR so that people loaded into the CRMCS will be able to get a special sunflower decal on their drivers license to provide additional identification on-scene at an incident.

K-SERV– KDEM is coordinating with KDHE to write out a plan for the possible vetting of medical personnel qualifications through K-SERV.

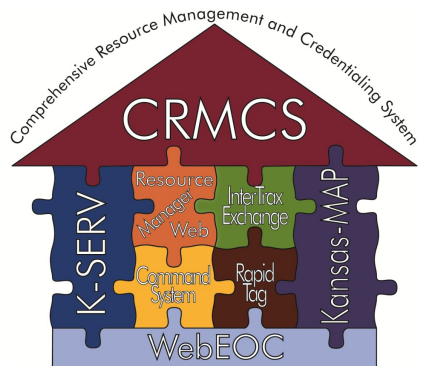
